Lesson Overview

Scripture - Leviticus 4:1-5

Main Point - In the New Testament

Jesus died for our sins to forgive us,
but in the Old Testament, a sin
offering is how the people were
forgiven by God.

Read the Scripture

Leviticus 4:1-35

Help the children retell the story in their own words.

- What happened first?
- What happened next?
- What happened last?

For younger students...

Discuss the story with the students.

- Why did God's people have to make sacrifices?
- Do we have to make sacrifices now?
- Who made the ultimate sacrifice?

For older students...

Discuss the story with the students.

- What does this story say about God?
- What does this story say about us?
- What do we need to obey from this passage?

Do the craft with the students.



Craft Instructions

Today we learned that the in the Old Testament, God's people had to make sacrifices in order to receive forgiveness from their sins. We also learned that because of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, we can all receive forgiveness!

Materials


- pre-made coloring sheet
- crayons, markers, pastels

Instructions

Step 1 - Pass out one coloring sheet to each student along with markers, crayons, or pastels.

Step 2 - Instruct them to color the page and remember that God forgives sins because of Jesus.


Step 3 - Allow the students to take their creations home with them.





Vocabulary Practice

Flash Cards




Step 1- Cut out each card along the green lines.

Step 2- Use the flash cards to teach the students the English word for each picture.

Step 3- Optional: Punch a hole in the top left corner of each card. Put them on a ring and have the students practice flipping through the cards while reading each word.

Matching Game



Step 1- Cut out each card along the green lines.

Step 2- Teach the children the English words by connecting them with the corresponding picture. If you need help matching them, look at the flash cards. Step 3- Matching Game: Spread out the cards face-up on a flat surface. Make sure that they are mixed up. Have the children pick up a word or picture card and match it with the corresponding word or picture.

Vocabulary Games

Flashcard Game Ideas:

The flashcards are the cards with the picture and word on the same side of the card. These flashcards are meant to help the student learn the English word for each picture. These cards can be used by putting them on a metal ring and having the student flip through the cards as they practice saying the word that goes with each picture.

Matching Game Ideas:

For these four games, you can use the matching cards. The matching cards have a picture card and a word card that go together.



For this first game, start by laying the picture cards face down. (Do not use the word cards.) Have the students, one-by-one, pick up a card and flip it over and say the English word for that picture card.



For this game, lay the picture cards face-up on a flat surface. (Do not use the word cards.) Next, ask the students, one-by-one, where each picture card is. Do this by saying the English word for the picture on the card. Example: Where is the dog? Where is the dog?



For this game, give each student a picture card. Then, call out one of the English words. Example: "Door". If a student has that picture card, have them hold it up, say the word, and show their friends.



For this game, lay out all of the cards (word cards and picture cards) face-up on a flat surface. One-by-one, allow the students to pick up an English word card and match it with the picture card. Try the other way by having the students pick up the picture card and match it with the English word card.

For a harder version of this game, lay all of the cards (word cards and picture cards) face-down. Have the children pick up a card and then pick up a second card. If they match, they can keep them. If they don't match they must put them back face-down and let the next student have a turn.
