Lesson Overview


Moral - "I am Responsible"

Note to the Teacher

Lesson Outline

Read the Story

Help the children retell the story in their own words.

- What happened first?
- What happened next?
- What did God do on the last day?

For younger students...

Discuss the story with the students.

- What does it mean to be responsible?
- Nabil was responsible by cleaning his room.
- What are you responsible for?

For older students...

Discuss the story with the students.

- What does it mean to be responsible?
- How was Nabil being responsible in the story?
- How can you be responsible?

Do the craft with the students.

Story

One day it was raining on the island and our friends, Nabil and Nabila, were playing games at Nabil's house. They were having so much fun playing all their favorite games. Eventually, the rain stopped, and the sun came out.

When Nabila noticed that the sun was shining, she said, "Look Nabil! The sun is shining. We can go play outside now with our friends!" Then Nabila got up and ran to the door.

"Wait!" Nabil stopped her, "We have to clean up first."

"Nabil," she whined, "that's not fun! Can we clean up later?"

Nabil thought about it for a second. He wanted to play outside too and Nabila was right, playing in a lot more fun than cleaning. But, Nabil knew what the right thing to do was, and so he replied, "No. We should clean up our mess now. My mom and dad gave me these games, and I am responsible for taking good care of them. It won't take long. Will you please help me, Nabila?"

Nabila didn't want to help clean up because she wanted to play outside, but she knew that she was responsible for helping her friend, and so she said, "Yes, Nabil, I will help you. And then after we clean up, can we go play at the volleyball court?"

"Yes. That's a great idea, Nabila! Thank you for helping me!"

Craft Instructions

Materials

- glue




Step 1 – Hand out the coloring sheets, coloring supplies and scissors.

Step 2 – Have the students begin by coloring in the coloring sheet.

Step 3 – Next, have the children cut out the toys at the bottom of the page.

Step 4 - Remind the children of how Nabil and Nabila were responsible by cleaning up Nabil's bedroom. Have the children glue the toys on the shelf as they pretend to "clean up" the bedroom.

Step 1- Cut out each card along the blue lines. Step 2- Use the flash cards to teach the students the English word for each picture. Step 3- Optional: Punch a hole in the top left corner of each card. Put them on a ring and have the students practice flipping through the cards while reading each word.




